Our next item is to post our church profile, position summary, and Joint Needs
Assessment Report on ChurchHub, which is a web link with United Church of
Canada. Once that is completed, then potential ministerial applicants will be able
to view our profile and position summary and be able to apply. We hope to have
everything posted on ChurchHub at around the time of our church AGM (February
24th). Tentatively the closing date for applications should be around April 12th.

After that we would conduct initial then secondary interviews; then select the candidate and then have a congregational meeting. With all that we are hoping to have a tentative start date for the new Minister as of July 1, which is the start of the pastoral year.
